FOUNDATION SUPPORTS THEATRE EXPERIENCES IN 2022

For a young person, being part of an audience or playing a theatrical role provides many new learning experiences. Durand students at several grade levels had an opportunity to either see a play or to act in one. For 7th and 8th graders, it was a field trip to see *A Christmas Carol* at Meadow Brook Theatre on the campus of Oakland University. For elementary students it was acting or supporting their classmate actors in the Disney Musical, *Aladdin*. For many students, this was their first theatre experience. Durand Educational Foundation provided funding to help with the cost of both events.

Even though kids today are surrounded with technology and rapidly changing imagery, there is still something intriguing about the theatrical processes. After seeing the *Christmas Carol* performance, Lyza, a student at Durand Middle School, said, "A part I found cool was how the house rotated even though it was made out of bricks." While observing set and costume changes, kids were quickly immersed into the production. "It felt so real' said Kayla C. "If I get a chance to go to another play, I totally would go."

Ms. Klooster, 7th grade English teacher summarized the theatre visit by saying, "Many students reflected how Scrooge made bad decisions but was able to reflect upon them through the different spirits he encountered. He then changed his ways to live happily for the rest of his life. Students recognized that the choices they make on a daily basis have

consequences, positive and negative, that affect their lives; and that many times, they will not get a second chance to rectify mistakes."

Students at Robert Kerr School also had a unique theatre experience when staff landed a free *Disney Musicals in Schools* program that was available to a limited number of elementary schools. Through the program, the school received performance rights and teaching guides for a 30 minute musical specifically written for elementary school performers.

Music teacher Evan Garner and 5th grade teacher Tina Franks coached after school sessions for approximately 38 students for several months to prepare them for the performance of *Aladdin* which took place on the Robert Kerr School stage. Later, some of the students were able to join actors from other schools to perform the play at Wharton Center at Michigan State University.

According to Luke, the Durand student who played Aladdin, "The Wharton Center was an amazing way to wrap up all of our shows and the stage was awesome. It was really fun to see the other schools perform. For anyone who wants to do *Disney Musicals in the Schools*, or any musical theatre, you definitely should try it. It feels great to show your family and friends your performance and you could even make a career out of acting someday."

NEW WEBSITE FOR FOUNDATION •

Since its inception, Durand Educational Foundation has relied on the school district and its tech employees to have web based information available to the public. Late in 2021, the Foundation Board decided there was a need for things that the current system could not address: Donors and staff need to see what the Foundation is doing on a more frequent basis. Staff members need the ability to apply for grants online rather than relying on a cumbersome paper application. And, the ability to accept online and credit card donations would offer additional options for users.

After researching options with several companies, the Foundation Board decided to have AZee Business Solutions from Owosso create the new website. The site will still be visible on Durand Area Schools website, however, it will meet the needs that have been identified and DEF board will be trained to handle updates and other processes.



For the past three decades, his work has appeared in national and international publications including the Wall Street Journal, Barrons, and the Chronicle of Higher Education, as well as a long list of published books for companies like Penguin, MacMillan and Dover. The graphic novel, What Unites Us, by Dan Rather (et.al.) and illustrated by Tim Foley was released in 2021. The book contains over 265 pages of Foley's illustrations. In his spare time, Tim plays and writes music with his group "Jukejoint Handmedowns." He is also principle bassist for the Kent Philharmonic Orchestra.
